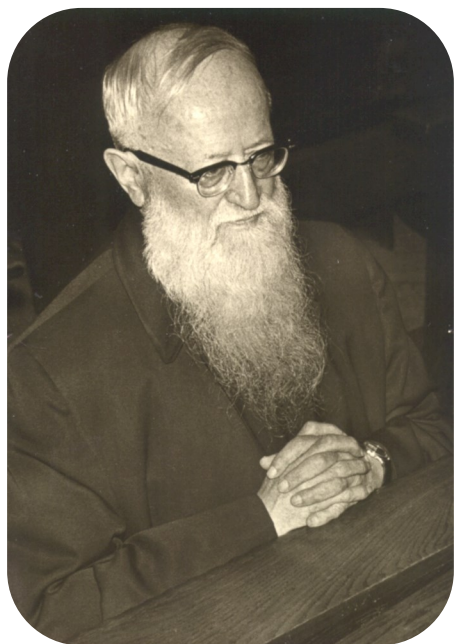


Secretariat Father Joseph Kentenich

My support

"The whole world surges back and forth." - These words, spoken by Fr. Kentenich in 1940, could just as well be said in view of our situation today. At that time, the Second World War had begun; insecurity and fear reigned everywhere. Today, in addition to new armed conflicts in Europe, there are insecurities on many levels, whether we think of health, the economy, society, the Church or other areas.

In addition, there are often



personal challenges that are very unsettling and nowhere to find a secure hold. Prayer requests that are reported to our secretariat bear witness to this: people who are

losing their jobs, who do not know whether they will survive a serious illness, who see no way out of a relationship crisis...

"The whole world surges back and forth" – and we feel helpless and powerless. If you continue reading words from Father Kentenich, the conclusion is: "All the more we must know that we are secure in God."

The founder of Schoenstatt likes to use the image of a pendulum to illustrate man's attitude to life. He invites us to conquer a certain security of the pendulum, "pendulum security":

"Towards the bottom, the pendulum is insecure; it can be set in motion by any breeze. It is often similar with the security of man on earth. Where does the pendulum have its security? At the top at the hook. It is similar with man. I am secured only in God. The man of today has no security with men on earth... What is needed is the bond with the great God."

Father Kentenich lived out of this trusting security. One of his longtime collaborators testifies: "When I met Father Kentenich and later was able to work with

him, my strongest impression was from the beginning: Here is a man who believes very concretely in the reality of God's presence in his life and dares to actively respond to it. Never before had I met a person with whom one could feel this mysterious presence of God so vividly, who was so completely imbued with it and who, in his

decisions, was always determined by it. And the strangest thing: He made no fuss about it at all.... Already after the first meeting I reflected on how this could be: God seemed very close to him, very familiar; one had the impression that he had just come from a conversation with him."

Impulses from Father Kentenich - Life from security in God

"In many things, we do not understand why the good God allows them. But he is all-wise; he knows why. He holds the reins of world events and our personal destiny in his hands; he directs and guides all that happens."

"What a sovereign peace it gives to be able to say to myself, 'God has entrusted my life, my work into his almighty fatherly hand! I have no other thing to do than to sovereignly and trustingly turn my gaze to him again and again. Therefore: Rooted in the supernatural world!'"

"The almighty God is above us. We are his children, safe in his hand. This gives us divine security. When do we feel safe? When someone loves us and we know he is powerful."

"Let us strive, in plain, simple, enlightened trust, not to let go of the hand of the Father. After all, we know the Heavenly Father has the power to protect and guide us; we only need to hold on to his benevolent hand."

Information on the current status in the beatification process for Father Joseph Kentenich

Dear Readers,

On May 3, 2022, the Bishop of Trier, Dr. Stephan Ackermann, announced his decision to suspend the beatification process for Father Joseph Kentenich for the time being. Since 1975, the diocesan investigation in the beatification process for Father Kentenich has been carried out in the diocese of Trier because Father Kentenich died in this diocese on September 15, 1968. Thus the responsibility for the process lies with the respective Bishop of Trier.

The news of the suspension of the process of beatification has had a great impact on many who are in favor of the founder of Schoenstatt and who are committed to his canonization. Therefore, a few brief comments on the decision of Bishop Dr. Ackermann.

What does this decision mean?

The suspension of the process does not mean that it is finished.

Rather, Bishop Dr. Stephan Ackermann expresses, that for the moment he will not actively continue to give time for further free research to clarify some questions. These questions, especially about the accusations made public two years ago against Father Kentenich, were not new; they had had been made in the process of beatification and were

dealt with there. However, the bishop considers the previous investigations of the complex subject matter as insufficient. The press release of the Diocese of Trier states: 'The discussions of the last two years have shown that more in-depth research on the person and work of Joseph Kentenich is needed,' said Bishop Ackermann.

'That is why I would very much welcome it if there is corresponding research in the coming years.' At the same time, it was important for the bishop to point out that the suspension of the proceedings does not mean judgment of the life and work of Father Kentenich.

How does Schoenstatt react to this decision?

For the Schoenstatt Movement, the integrity of Father Kentenich is not in question. The fact that the proceedings have only been suspended shows that nothing has been proven that would speak against the continuation of the trial.

The request of the bishop to use this time for intensive research - also by scholars outside of Schoenstatt - meets a heartfelt concern of Father Kentenich. He wrote in 1964 during his exile that Schoenstatt "should not only be taken note of by ecclesiastical authorities, but also studied, critically evaluated and with their blessing sent out into the wide

world".

In the statement of the General Presidium it says in this sense: "Where previously, out of consideration for the ongoing beatification proceedings, restraint and discretion were required, questions and findings can now be dealt with and communicated with the necessary openness. Considerations as to the framework the research will take are underway. The bishop's decision is an impulse for us as Schoenstatters. The further research of the connections can help us understand the founder of Schoenstatt even better, also as a personality who was aware of his mission for the Church. Our striving for a contemporary authentic Christian life that helps to shape Church and society, is the best way to keep Father Kentenich alive in his significance for today."

What are the consequences?

The call of St. Pope John Paul II to the Schoenstatt Movement in 1985: "You (must) canonize him!" is still valid. So it is and remains our task to continue to make Fr. Kentenich known to many people and to present his person, his life and his message. Through private veneration, we do not anticipate the judgment of the Church, on the contrary. A private devotion must be present if a person is to be beatified and canonized. The Secretariat of Father Joseph Kentenich continues to distribute

the writings that make him known and inspire confidence in him and his intercession. You can freely report your concerns that you have .

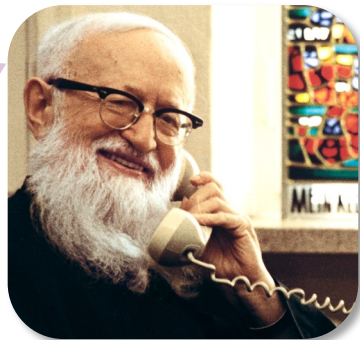

In the spring of 2021, my girlfriend was diagnosed with a tumor on one kidney. It had to be checked. 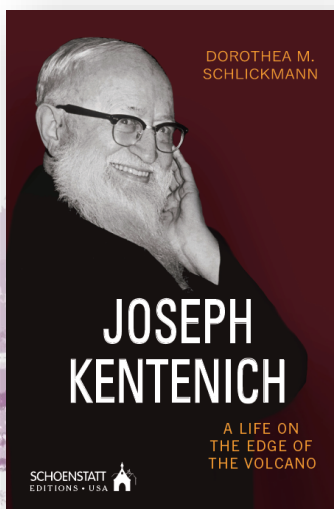
- Founder of the International Schoenstatt Movement -
